

About N.A.G.

Nevadans Against Garbage (N.A.G.) is a single-issue organization of concerned citizens who have come together to STOP the proposed Jungo Road Landfill. This landfill would:

- **Bring in 4000 tons of non-recyclable waste per day**, from Northern California, via rail, 5 days a week for 95 years.
- **Occupy a space just off Jungo Road of 640 acres** (1 square mile), with the possibility to expand to 2560 acres (4 square miles). The site is at Township 35N, Range 33E of the Mount Diablo Baseline and Meridian.
- **Be built well within 100 feet over an active aquifer**, requiring a variance to the 100 ft limit put in place by Nevada statues to protect the public.

N.A.G. remains pro-business growth and supports bringing in diverse industry with a solid business case to fuel the Winnemucca economy without jeopardizing the health and welfare of the community.

Jungo Road Landfill

- **April, 2007, a 3-year conditional use permit (CUP) is issued** to Jungo Land Investments, a subsidiary of Recology, to build a landfill by the Humboldt County Regional Planning Commission (RPC). *At that time, local ordinances only allowed for one landfill.*
- **October, 2007, officials changed local ordinances to allow for a second landfill.**
- **February, 2010, Recology requests an extension of their CUP for 5 more years, blaming 'angry citizens' for delays.** By Recology's own timeline, these 'angry citizens' did not speak up until 2+years into the CUP timeline, making it impossible for them to be the source of delays.
- **April, 2010, Humboldt County Commissioners overturn the RPC decision to grant a 5 year extension of the CUP.**
- **Also in April, Recology files papers** requesting a judicial review of the commission decision, as well as papers to sue Humboldt County *and* the individual Humboldt County Commissioners.

- **June, 2010, the Humboldt Development Authority accepts \$3500 from Recology to fund their Winnemucca Futures planning project** even though Recology has filed lawsuits against other county agencies and individuals and are not an established local business.
- **The November 2010 ballot voter initiative limiting the amount of out of town waste to one and a half times the amount generated by regional users of the Humboldt County landfill was passed by 70% of the voters.** This limit equates to approximately 15,000 tons per year vs. Recology's projected *1.2 million*. Recology had 'directed' the Humboldt County District Attorney to file suit against this voter initiative when it was put on the ballot via petition.

Site Concerns

The landfill will be built 35 feet above an active aquifer; much closer than the 100 feet limit statutes allows for and which requires an exception. The USGS study, published in March, 2010, noted water contamination would occur. However, the study was incomplete. A request to finish the study has been made. The study remains incomplete. No environmental impact study (EIS) has been required via the CUP or state laws, and Recology has refused to perform one.

Current Status, October, 2011

Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) will go to public comment late in October or early November. However, the law suit Recology has filed against Humboldt County for

not extending their permit is not resolved. Oral arguments are not scheduled until January 9, 10am Reno Courtroom 6. Recology has also opened offices in Winnemucca.

- ***Question the business case.*** Claims of new schools, performing art centers are not fact based. Recology cannot sign any contracts for revenue until they are permitted.
- ***Demand answers on the environment.*** Do not be lulled by promises of technology. No EIS has been done.
